New Sales and Use Tax Rate Effective January 1, 2023

The tax rate change listed below applies only within the indicated city or county limits. The new tax rate and tax code will be available to view and download as a spreadsheet on December 1, 2022, on our webpage, [California City & County Sales & Use Tax Rates](#). ¹ The existing city tax of 1.00 percent was scheduled to decrease to 0.50 percent effective January 1, 2023. However, Measure A, approved by voters in the March 2020 election, decreases the city tax rate to 0.75 percent effective January 1, 2023. Although the city tax rate is decreasing by 0.25 percent, the combined city and county tax rate will remain the same due to Los Angeles County Measure H's 0.25 percent tax, which will take effect in Long Beach starting January 1, 2023. A new code is required.

² The existing city tax of 1.00 percent will expire December 31, 2022, decreasing the city tax rate by 1.00 percent.
